However, a single course may satisfy both a General Education and a restricted or specified elective requirement.**
- **A single course may satisfy both a General Education and a Minor requirement.**
- **A course satisfying either Intensive requirement may also satisfy any other requirement except for a College-Level Competency or a prerequisite for one.**
- **A course satisfying the Information and Technology Literacy requirement may also satisfy any other requirement.**
